The mass murder of the European Jewish population as part of the history of the Jews is inseparable from the present and the future of the Jewish community. The national socialists (Nazis) succeeded in banishing and murdering almost all of the Jews of Kassel. The immigration of Jews from the former Soviet Union during the early nineties allowed a new Jewish community to come into existence in the city.

The Sara Nussbaum Center focuses on all three epochs of local Jewish history. The achievements and suffering of the past are of equal importance as the current sentiments of the Jews living in Kassel today. The future, with its yearnings and hopes, but also uncertainties and fears, lies before us. We want to help shape this future.
